

# EPR2025 Infographic Design Contest

## Terms and Conditions

1. The competition is open to nationals of [IAEA Member States](#).
2. Participants must be between 18 and 35 years old on the date of submission.
3. Only individual submissions are allowed, and each participant may submit only one entry.
4. The official language of the contest is English; therefore, all content of the submissions must be in English.
5. The infographic must be an original work by the participant and should be free of elements that may violate or infringe upon the copyright of any other person or organization. It is the responsibility of the participant and not of the IAEA to ensure that all content used in the drawing is free from copyright. Any infringing infographic will immediately be disqualified.
6. AI tools may be used to assist with inspiration but cannot be used to generate designs. The information provided in the infographics cannot be generated by AI. Works that are 100% AI-generated will not be accepted. All AI assistance must be explicitly disclosed. This disclosure should include which elements were created with AI assistance, which AI tools were used, and how AI was incorporated. Failure to disclose AI usage will result in disqualification.
7. The infographic must be in PDF, JPEG or PNG format with a high, unblurred resolution. Both horizontal and vertical formats are allowed.
8. The submission consists of an infographic, which must be sent as an attachment to [EPRFuture@iaea.org](mailto:EPRFuture@iaea.org), along with the completion of the online form available at the following link:

9. Participants must complete the online form using the same email address from which the infographic is sent. The list of selected IAEA EPR publications is available within the form.
10. The deadline for submission is Sunday, August 31st, 2025, at 11:59 PM (CET). Submissions received after the deadline will not be considered.
11. Entries will be evaluated by an expert jury based on visual clarity, originality, and particular emphasis in technical accuracy.
12. Winning participants will be notified during the third week of September. Once notified, winners must respond within 10 natural days and provide the requested documents, which may include, but are not limited to, a copy of the picture page of a valid passport and the editable design file of the infographic. Failure to respond within this timeframe will result in forfeiture of the prize.
13. The winner may be required to participate in an online meeting prior to the conference and must follow all instructions provided by the IAEA to facilitate their participation during the conference, including compliance with logistical arrangements, the assignment of a designated station, and making any requested modifications to their infographic.
14. The participant agrees to assign to the IAEA all copyright in and to the infographic, including, but not limited to the right to publish, transmit, sell, distribute, modify, create derivative works and otherwise use the drawing in electronic and print versions throughout the world, in all languages and in all media of expression now known or later developed, and to license or permit others to do so; and the participant certifies that no other rights have been granted which could conflict with the right hereby given to the IAEA.
15. By submitting the infographic, the participant further agrees that the IAEA, UN-NYG may publish the infographic together with the participant's full name, age and nationality on their websites and, social media and other platforms.
16. Data collected will not be shared further than outlined in these terms and kept only for the purpose of notifying and acknowledging the winners and organizing the travel arrangements, thereafter the data collected will be deleted.
